We know that this time is a chance for families to do things together and learn about each other, have self-reliance and deep experiences that happen in your homes and with families. Remember that learning is not always from a book. There's lots to be discovered by pulling apart a bike, or going for a walk!

### **Home Learning:**

The hard packs sent out on the weekend were well received by you and by our pupils. Kids were pleased to see their own books and pencil cases! We won't be able to refill these hard-packs, but we will supply Distance Learning online until the lockdown is complete. From tomorrow each teacher will be in touch with you daily, by 9am, to tell you what your child could be doing each day (reading, writing, maths, and perhaps a fun activity). #### **Level 3 Thinking:**

Level 4 won't last forever, and so we are turning our minds to what Level 3 will look like for our families. Level 3 is still about ensuring the safety of people to ensure the COVID virus does not spread. Children of workers who MUST return to work, and who do not have other supervision available to them, can send their children to be supervised at school under Level 3. At Level 3, the vast majority of families will remain at home, and home learning will continue. Level 3 is a hard juggle for teachers - we are still doing online learning as well as supervising children in school. Students coming to school at Level 3, will be doing their online learning activities. There will be strict rules around drop off at 8.45am and pick up at 2.45pm. Buses will not be running at Level 3.

He will need to know your work, and the names of children you need to have at school. Please do this by Friday morning at the latest.
